

Postdoctoral Research Associate—Public Health Policy (Quantitative Analysis)

The Health Policy Center within the Institute for Health Research and Policy at the University of Illinois at Chicago has an immediate opening for a postdoctoral research associate to focus on quantitative analyses related to obesity policy issues. This is a one-year appointment with the possibility of renewal.

The successful candidate will conduct quantitative research related to the impact of public policies on school and community level practices and child/ adolescent behaviors as well as policy diffusion and event history analyses of the factors influencing policy development. The candidate will also work with senior staff to pursue external funding for research.

The successful candidate will have: a Ph.D. in political science, public policy, economics, or a closely related field; significant knowledge and interest in analysis of obesity policy issues as demonstrated by research, publications, consulting and conference presentations; experience with, and sophisticated knowledge of, advanced statistical techniques for the social sciences including hierarchical linear modeling and/or structural equation modeling; and demonstrated ability to write effectively and give effective presentations.
