FACTS ABOUT PROBATION

A student will be placed on academic probation in any term in which either a cumulative or semester UIC grade point average of less than 2.00/4.00 is earned. A student on probation is expected to earn at least a 2.50 semester GPA until the cumulative average is raised to a 2.00. The probation rules apply to all students. Academic probation at UIC cannot be removed by course work from other colleges or universities.

Levels of Probation/Dismissal

- Academic Probation
Semester GPA is below a 2.00
- Terminal Probation
UIC Cumulative GPA is below a 2.00
- Dismissal
UIC Cumulative GPA is significantly below a 2.00 and/or not making progress toward a degree in business

Probation Rules

- 1) A student in good academic standing is placed on academic probation in any term in which less than a 2.00 grade point average is earned.
- 2) A student currently on academic probation is continued on academic probation (unless dismissed from the University) until both the cumulative and the UIC grade point averages are raised to 2.00.

Dismissal Rules

- 1) A student on academic probation who fails to earn a 2.50 grade point average in any term may be dismissed from the University unless both the cumulative and UIC grade point averages are at a 2.00 or higher.
- 2) A student who fails to earn at least a 1.00 grade point average in any term may be dismissed from the University.
- 3) A student who fails to make progress toward their degree may be dismissed from the university. This includes failure to complete your required math or English composition courses.
