BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The mission of the College of Business Administration is to serve undergraduate students by providing a supportive environment that will encourage them to meet their academic and professional goals. The College of Business Administration offers a Bachelor of Science degree in one of the seven following majors: accounting, economics, entrepreneurship, finance, information and decision sciences, management and marketing. In addition students can choose one of the three following minors: International Business, Labor Markets and Workforce Development and Real Estates. A Certificate in Entrepreneurial Studies is also available. In addition to the academic options, the CBA Career Center offers a Corporate Intern Program giving students the opportunity to get full and part-time paid internships to compliment their educational experience. Completion of the degree requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. In additional, completion of two years of a single foreign language in high school or one year of a single foreign language at the college level and completion of a cultural diversity requirement is required for graduation. Courses that satisfy the cultural diversity requirement are noted with a (●) on the other side of this form.

TRANSFER ADMISSION GUIDELINES

The College reserves the right to adjust admissions criteria based on space availability. The following guidelines are the minimum requirements needed in order to be considered for admission into the College. Meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission. The College reviews multiple factors and admission is always contingent on space availability. Transfer applicants must earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 (A=4.0) in at least 36 semester hours (54-quarter hours). Completion of finite math and calculus prior to applying is highly recommended and may be used as a deciding factor when considering for admission.

We strongly recommend that students choose a maximum of 60 semester hours of courses listed on this guide to maximize the transferability of coursework. This guide is based on Elgin's 2004-05 catalog and UIC's 2005-07 catalog and is valid for students who enroll through Fall 2007.
