- List techniques used in eyelid/orbital/socket reconstruction.
- Identify the fundamentals of cosmetic eyelid/facial surgery; and describe techniques for addressing eyelid/facial scarring

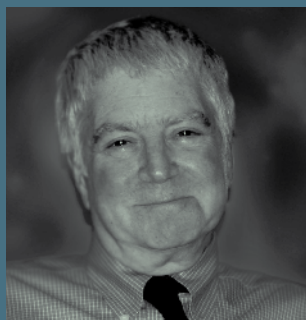
