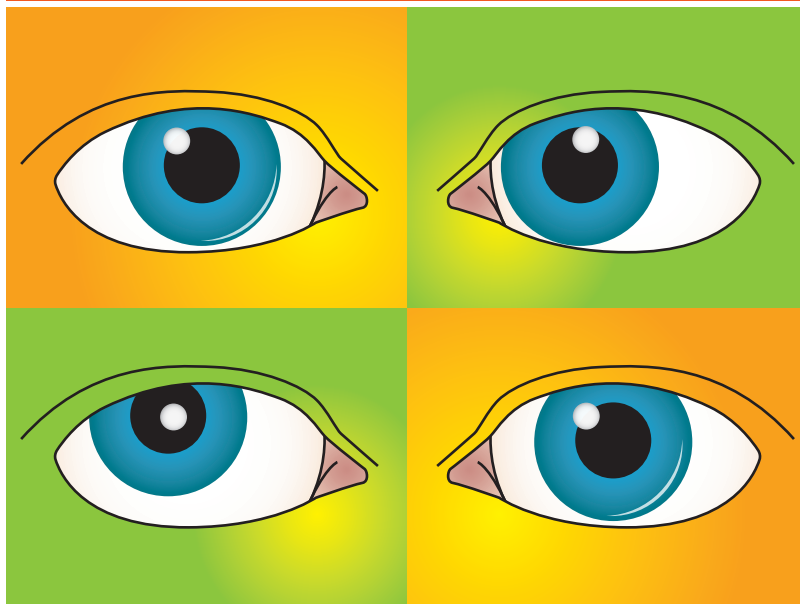

Symposium.

Purpose

The purpose of this symposium is to educate ophthalmologists on the latest updates and information in pediatric and adult strabismus, including concepts, diagnosis, surgical approaches, and alternative treatments.

Intended Audience

This course has been designed for ophthalmologists, ophthalmology fellows, residents, optometrists, ophthalmic surgical nurses and assistants, orthoptists, and ophthalmic technologists/technicians encompassing all levels of experience and knowledge.

Objectives

1. Review the anatomy of the extraocular muscles and basic principles of strabismus assessment and management.
2. Discuss recent advancements on the management of paralytic strabismus.
3. List alternatives in the treatment of strabismus.
4. Review and discuss controversies on inferior oblique surgeries.
5. Describe esotropia in pediatric and adult population.
6. Illustrate basic and advanced concepts of strabismus.
