Dr. Guell has been Associate Professor of Ophthalmology at Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona since 1991. He serves as Coordinator of the Cornea and Refractive Surgery Unit at Instituto de Microcirugia Ocular of Barcelona, as an Editorial Board Member of Journal of Cataract & Refractive Surgery and as Secretary of the Fundación Para la Obtención de Corneas. He has been Secretary of the European Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery since September 2003.

Marvin D. Henry, MD

Marvin D. Henry was born on November 18, 1922 in New York City. After attending Lane Technical High School in Chicago, he attended the University of Illinois and earned an AB degree in general curriculum from the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences in 1944. He received his MD from the University of Illinois College of Medicine in 1946. He was an intern at Henrotin Hospital in Chicago from 1946-47 and completed his Ophthalmology residency at the VA Hospital in Hines, IL in 1953.

While attending the University of Illinois, Dr. Henry served with the First Company of the Navy Y-12 Unit and was a member of Phi Delta Epsilon. He also served as Lieutenant, Junior Grade, in the United States Naval Reserve from 1947-1949.

While at Hines Hospital, he co-authored and published one of the first papers on Sickle cell disease. He was Chairman of Ophthalmology at Illinois Central Hospital, was Assistant Chairman and Senior Attending Ophthalmologist at Michael Reese Hospital and was affiliated with Ingalls Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Henry practiced Ophthalmology for thirty-five years in Flossmoor, IL. He specialized in cataract and laser surgery. He was a fellow of the American College of Surgeons, a member of the American Medical Association, Chicago Ophthalmological Society, American Academy of Ophthalmology, American Intraocular Implant Society, Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology, Contact lens Association of Ophthalmologists, and Pan-American Association of Ophthalmologists.

Dr. Henry was married to Diane Henry and they have five children. Dr. Henry passed away on July 17, 1987. His wife Diane is a member of the Illinois Eye Fund Board.

In recognition and in memory of Dr. Henry's many accomplishments in Ophthalmology, his family established the Dr. Marvin D. Henry Memorial Fund to support an annual lecture for the Department of Ophthalmology.
