- If you are currently enrolled at UIC as a graduate student, you do not need to complete this application. Please contact your current department or the Graduate College for instructions regarding changing to a new program, becoming a joint degree student, or changing your degree sought.
- If you are interested in pursuing a postbaccalaureate degree in the Graduate College at UIC, your application is evaluated by an academic department and recommended for admission to a graduate program, while also meeting the requirements of the Graduate College. In addition to making the preliminary admissions recommendation, the department is the primary unit for distribution of fellowships, assistantships, and tuition waivers. Consequently, it is the responsibility of the applicant to make him/herself aware of additional application credentials required and deadlines established by the department of interest.
- All documents submitted to UIC become the property of the University. Documents will not be released to students or forwarded to other institutions or agencies.
- With the permission of the department and the Graduate College, admitted degree applicants may defer their admission once per application, within one year of the original term of application. Contact the program for more information.
- Services, access, and reasonable accommodations can be arranged for students with varied types of documented disabilities. Students with disability/access needs or questions may contact the Office of Disability Services at (312) 413-2183 (voice) or (312) 413-0123 (TTY only).

Minimum Graduate College Admissions Requirements for All Applicants

- A. Completion of a baccalaureate degree (or an acceptable equivalent) from an approved institution; some programs also require a professional school degree or certification (see Graduate Program Summary section).
- B. Undergraduate grade point average of at least 3.75 (A=5.00) for the final 60 semester (90 quarter) hours of baccalaureate study, including all of the work taken in the term in which the student began the final 60 semester hours of study (programs may require a higher GPA). A cumulative grade point average obtained for all work completed beyond the baccalaureate will also be computed and considered, if applicable. Note: Minimum grade point average equivalent for international coursework is 4.00 (A=5.00).
- C. Recommendation for admission to the Graduate College by the graduate program to which application is made. All recommendations are subject to final approval by the Graduate College.

Application Deadline

Deadlines are listed in the Application and Credentials Deadlines section. Please note that some programs fill up before the deadline, so you are urged to submit completed application materials as early as possible. All deadlines are subject to change without notice. Applications received bearing a postmark later than the application deadline date will be returned to the applicant. Applications not complete by the deadline date are subject to cancellation.

Application Fee

A nonrefundable application fee (\$40 domestic or immigrant applicant, \$50 international applicant*) must be submitted with this application unless you have previously been enrolled as a graduate student at UIC. Attach a money order or personal check, payable to the University of Illinois, to the top of the application. This fee must be submitted before a review of your application credentials will be made. University of Illinois employees requesting application fee waivers based on their employment should fill out question 24 on the application. Beyond those mentioned, other requests for a waiver of the application fee will not be considered.

* An international applicant is a citizen or permanent resident alien of a country or political area other than the United States who has a residence outside the United States to which he or she expects to return and either is, or proposes to be, a temporary alien in the United States for educational purposes.

NOTE: If you have completed any postsecondary studies outside the United States, please read the information regarding education credentials and English Language Proficiency in the International and Immigrant Applicants section.

Department Admission Credentials

Most departments require additional credentials. Consult the department regarding additional credentials and send them directly to the department of interest (see the Graduate Program Summary section for addresses). If the department requires a standardized test, you must request that your test scores be sent to UIC by the testing agency. Consult the agency information bulletin for the UIC code number. Examples of credentials required by graduate departments include: Graduate Record Examination, general and/or subject; Graduate Management Admissions Test; Miller Analogies Test; letters of recommendation; portfolio; personal statement; etc.

International and Immigrant/Other Noncitizen Applicants

International Applicants

Applicants who require an F-1 or J-1 visa must apply as full-time, degree-seeking students. Applicants admitted to UIC will receive written notification and an official document (I-20 or IAP-66) to be presented when requesting their visa to enter the United States.

The application and supporting documents must be in our office prior to the special deadline for international applicants. Review of your application will begin after the Office of Admissions has received all of the following materials:

1. Completed and signed application received on or before the deadline date.

2. Nonrefundable \$50 application fee (bank draft or money order in U.S. currency and made payable to the University of Illinois). No review of an application or credentials can be made without a fee. The application fee cannot be waived or deferred regardless of the currency restrictions imposed by some countries.
3. Evidence of English competency. Official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) administered by the Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey 08540. The Michigan English Language Battery (MELAB), offered by the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48109, is also acceptable. The test must have been taken within the last two years. Minimum scores required: paper-based TOEFL = 550 (computer-based TOEFL = 213), MELAB = 84. Individual programs and departments may require higher scores.
4. Evidence of financial support: (a) a Declaration of Finances form (available from the Office of Admissions), or (b) Immigration and Naturalization Services Affidavit of Support (INS form I-134) executed by the sponsor, or (c) a notarized affidavit of support executed by the sponsor. Any of these forms must be accompanied by the original or a certified copy of the bank statement showing proof of sufficient funds in U.S. dollars (checking accounts are not acceptable).
5. If you have studied outside the United States, you must have all postsecondary schools send directly to UIC all official credentials, including:
 - a list of all subjects/courses studied for **each** year
 - grades or examination results received (failing as well as passing) in each subject
 - maximum and minimum grades obtainable
 - degrees, certificates, diplomas awarded

Documents must be authentic or certified and sent directly to UIC from your institution(s). Those not in English must be accompanied by certified English translations. The University reserves the right to accept only documents deemed authentic.

6. UIC Office of Admissions policy regarding the authenticity of international credentials: All documents must be sent directly to UIC from the institutions attended. Official credentials should be sent in the original language and accompanied by a verbatim (word for word) English translation. Interpretative translations are not acceptable. All documents must be certified by the original signature of an authorized representative (Registrar) of the school and must bear the school's official seal. A translation obtained from a translation service/agency must appear on letterhead stationery and be signed by the preparer. All documents submitted become the property of the University. The University reserves the right to accept only the documents it deems authentic. It is the applicant's responsibility to insure that all documents and test scores are forwarded to UIC under their name as it appears on the application. Whenever possible, a U.S. Social Security Number or UIC assigned identification number should appear on the document.

Immigrant/Other Noncitizen Applicants

Immigrant applicants are persons who have become official permanent resident aliens of the United States. Other noncitizens are persons granted temporary residency, conditional entrance, parolee, refugee, or asylum status and who may be in the process of becoming immigrants.

The application and supporting documents must be in our office on or before the deadline date. To insure adequate time for the additional processing required by the evaluation of foreign credentials, it is strongly recommended that immigrant applicants observe the early application deadline date for international applicants. Review of your application will begin after the Office of Admissions has received all of the following materials.

1. Completed and signed application received on or before the deadline date.
2. Nonrefundable \$40 application fee (personal check or money order only in U.S. currency and made payable to the University of Illinois). No review of an application or credentials can be made without a fee.
3. Evidence of English competency. Official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) administered by the Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey 08540. The Michigan English Language

Battery (MELAB), offered by the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48109, is also acceptable. The test must have been taken within the last two years. Minimum scores required: TOEFL = 550, MELAB = 84. Individual programs and departments may require higher scores. In general, if you have just completed a minimum of two years of full-time, transferable study at the secondary or collegiate level in a country where English is the primary language as well as the language of instruction, the Office of Admissions may consider a waiver of the requirement.

4. Requirement: Proof of immigration status. Please attach a clear photocopy (front and back) of your Alien Registration Card and/or other appropriate INS documentation. Be aware that submission of these copies is no guarantee of their acceptability and that additional documentation and/or review of original documents may be required.
5. If you have studied outside the United States, you must have all postsecondary schools send directly to UIC all official credentials, including:
 - a list of all subjects/courses studied for **each** year
 - grades or examination results received (failing as well as passing) in each subject
 - maximum and minimum grades obtainable
 - degrees, certificates, diplomas awarded

Documents must be authentic or certified and sent directly to UIC from your institution(s). Those not in English must be accompanied by certified English translations. The University reserves the right to accept only documents deemed authentic.

6. Authenticity of international credentials. Immigrant and other applicants with international credentials should refer to the UIC policy regarding the authenticity of international credentials under #6 in the International Applicants section.

Nondegree Applicants

Applicants for general, unassigned nondegree status (curriculum code 5926) need only submit the application form, application fee, and proof of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university (copy of diploma or transcript with degree conferred and date are acceptable). Although some graduate programs encourage nondegree registration, others restrict their courses to degree students only. Individuals should consult the department offering the desired courses to see if they are available to nondegree students and for course prerequisites. If you later apply for and are admitted to a degree program you may transfer no more than 12 semester hours of acceptable credit from nondegree to degree status.

If you are interested in applying for nondegree status within a specific program, consult the department of interest to see if it accepts nondegree students and to find out if additional admission credentials must be submitted.

Multiple Applications

UIC offers students the opportunity to pursue more than one graduate degree at the same time, either through one of our approved joint degree programs, or through concurrent enrollment in more than one program. Approved joint degree programs share a certain number of courses that are used for both degrees. Currently offered joint degree programs are the MBA/MS Nursing; MBA/MS Accounting; MBA/MA Economics; MPH/MS Nursing; and MD/PhD. (Applicants to the MD/PhD program should not use this application form. This program requires a special application form that is available from the College of Medicine.)

Only one application fee per term is required. Applicants who wish to apply to more than one degree program must submit a separate application for each department involved, even if applying to an approved joint degree program. Those applying to more than one program should indicate on all applications submitted (question 21) whether they intend to pursue more than one degree at the same time.
