

Asclepias sullivantii

PRAIRIE MILKWEED (Milkweed Family)

in the **Peacock Prairie** at the **James Woodworth Prairie Preserve**



Flowers in umbels and with their petal-like part bent downward. The distinctive flowers have five erect hoods (the corona) comprising the upper part of the flower, with a curved horn projecting from each hood. Leaves nearly stalkless, smooth, not wavy-margined. Brownish through purplish colored flowers, 2-6' high (61-183 cm). At the Peacock/Woodworth Prairie blooms about the 1st week of June through the 1st week of July.
