

Baptisia leucophaea

CREAM WILD INDIGO (Pea Family)

in the **Peacock Prairie** at the **James Woodworth Prairie Preserve**



The hairy stems of this native perennial plant are recurved or sprawl along the ground. The alternate compound leaves are divided into three leaflets. The entire plant is grey-green in color. The showy inflorescence is about 1' long, and organized as a raceme that tends to droop toward the ground. The flowers are creamy white or light yellow, about 1" long, and look like typical large pea flowers. In the Peacock Prairie, blooms about 2nd week of May through 3rd week of June.
