

Euphorbia supina

SPOTTED CREEPING SPURGE (Spurge Family)

in the **Peacock Prairie** at the *James Woodworth Prairie Preserve*



Prostrate plants with often red-blotched leaves and stems, and insignificant whitish, green or reddish flowers scattered in the upper axils or at the ends of the branches. Leaves entire or vary finely toothed, $\frac{1}{4}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ " long. Stems hairy, spreading on the ground in several directions; often growing out of cracks in concrete sidewalks. At the Peacock/Woodworth Prairie, blooms about 1st week of September.
