### Identification Cards

Your retiree's identification card verifies your right to enjoy many of the privileges and services offered by the university. To obtain an i-card, you must have proof of retirement from your department, as well as a valid driver's license, passport, or state ID. There is currently no charge for the first ID as long as you turn in your faculty/staff card; however, there is a replacement fee for lost or stolen cards. At the time of retirement, faculty and staff members should contact one of the photo ID offices located in 1790 SSB or 242 UIC Student Center West. Telephone inquiries may be made at 413-5940.

### State Universities Retirement System (SURS)

The State Universities Retirement System (SURS) provides retirement, disability, and survivor benefits to eligible university employees. All changes or questions regarding annuities; automatic annual increases; death benefits; direct deposit of monthly payments; retired staff dental, health, and life insurance, mailing address; reemployment; survivor benefits; tax changes; and the newsletter should be referred to a SURS customer service representative. ## ASSOCIATIONS

### Annuitants Association

UIC UNITED, the UIC chapter of the State Universities Annuitants Association (SUAA), is one of more than 50 chapters across the state and has more than 1,600 members. Its purpose is to promote the individual and collective interests and welfare of its members and of all retirees and potential retirees of UIC. It works to achieve legislation favorable to retirees and to keep members informed of pending legislation that can be of importance to them. In addition, the Chapter disseminates current information on issues of general concern to senior citizens, provides a liaison between retirees and the campus administration, provides opportunities for socializing among members, and works to assure adequate funding of SURS. SUAA also works to improve benefits for retirees. The Chapter seeks ways in which retirees can help further the goals of the campus through volunteering, reemployment, financial support, and other activities. Membership is

open to all participants in SURS who have retired or who are eligible for a retirement annuity, their spouses, and their survivors. Any current employee or spouse of an employee may join SUAA. The UIC chapter has an office in Room 146F of the Physical Plant Building, phone 996-5834.

SUAA's political involvement arm, SUAAAction, provides members and chapters with a multitude of ways to get involved in the political process. These opportunities include everything from grassroots campaigning to attending fundraisers. ## **EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS**

### **Educational Benefits**

Retirees may be eligible for a tuition waiver to enroll in University courses, assuming that other conditions governing enrollment in such courses are satisfactorily met. Prior to enrollment, retirees must apply for admission within specified deadlines for a particular term. ### **Continuing Education**

The Office of Continuing Education works with academic units in the university to serve external audiences through specially created credit and noncredit courses. ### **University Library**

The University library is open to all retirees without restriction. Retirees with i-cards enjoy the same borrowing privileges for library materials as when they were employed. ## **PRIVILEGES AFTER RETIRING**

### **Reemployment of Retired Staff Members**

A retiree may be reemployed, if the needs of the university can be met by reemploying a retired academic or civil service staff member. A minimum break in employment of 60 days must be met to ensure the continuance of the retiree's retirement annuity. Before accepting reemployment with the university, a retiree should be familiar with the State Universities Retirement System's postretirement earnings restrictions. ### **Emeritus/Emerita Status**

When members of the faculty and senior administrators retire from active university service, they may be given the title "emeritus" or "emerita." Emeritus/a status is granted upon the recommendation, as appropriate, of the department, with the concurrence of the dean of the college, the Campus Emeritus Review Committee, the Provost, the Chancellor and the Board of Trustees. Ordinarily, emeritus/a status will not be

granted to an individual who has served fewer than seven years. Emeritus/a status does not imply any special privileges apart from those granted to all retired members of the academic staff. Emeritus/a faculty may, however, retain their UIC e-mail accounts without interruption or change. ## **FACILITIES AND EVENTS**

### **Admission Fees**

Reduced rates for campus programs, events, and services are often available to retirees and their companions. Proper identification must be shown. Please see the beginning of this brochure for information on how to obtain a retiree identification card.

### **Athletic Events**

The 10,000-seat UIC Pavilion (located on Harrison at Racine) is the site of UIC men's and women's intercollegiate basketball games, as well as a variety of concerts and family events. Tickets are available from the box office (413-5740) or Ticketmaster outlets ([www.ticketmaster.com](http://www.ticketmaster.com)). Volleyball, soccer, gymnastics, swimming & diving, baseball and softball along with other varsity athletic events are held on the UIC South Campus at the Physical Education Building (901 W. Roosevelt Road) and the Flames Athletic Center (839 W. Roosevelt Road) along with the outdoor venues behind those facilities.

### **UIC Student Centers**

UIC has two union buildings on campus—UIC Student Center West and UIC Student Center East. Both facilities offer several dining options, art galleries, lounges, bookstores, recreational facilities, and many other activities. ### **Cultural Events and Activities**

### **Faculty Lounge and Faculty Dining Room**

The Faculty/Staff Lounge and the Dean's Room, both located on the first floor of the Behavioral Sciences Building, are open to all faculty, staff, and retirees and include table service and a private dining room.

### **Parking**

Visitor parking is available in various locations around campus. Retirees who continue employment at the university may purchase parking at the faculty/staff rate. ### **Recreational Facilities**

Campus Recreation offers three facilities on campus—UIC Student Center East, UIC Student Center West, and the Physical Education Building. Each facility offers swimming, weight rooms, cardio equipment, and may offer exercise classes. Campus Recreation also offers personal training and fitness assessments at their Human Performance Lab. Retirees may purchase a membership for the same price as faculty and staff by showing their retiree i- card. Spouses/significant others may also join at the faculty/staff rate. ## **FINANCIAL SERVICES**

### **Credit Union**

Retirees and their families are eligible for membership at Credit Union 1, the UIC credit union. Services include free checking, savings, CDs, IRAs, ATM cards, MasterCard and Visa; and direct deposit of the retirement annuity. Personal, car, and student loans are also available. ### **Benefits Center**
