

HALDEMAN-JULIUS FAMILY

The Haldeman-Julius Family Papers comprise fourteen feet of material pertaining to the Haldeman, Addams, and Haldeman-Julius families - relatives of Jane Addams, founder of Hull-House, Chicago, Illinois. In 1868, five years after the death of his first wife, Sarah, John Huey Addams married Anna Hostetter Haldeman of Freeport, Illinois, widow of William Haldeman. Anna became Jane Addams' step-mother and brought her two sons to live with the Addams family in Cedarville, Illinois. The younger son, George B. Haldeman, was Jane's childhood companion, and the older son, Henry W. Haldeman, married Jane's sister, Sarah Alice, in 1875. The child of this second Haldeman-Addams marriage, (Anna) Marcet Haldeman, married socialist writer Emanuel Julius in 1916; subsequently the Haldeman and Julius names were legally combined. The Haldeman-Julius children--all living in 1969 - are Alice DeLoach, Henry Julius Haldeman, and Josephine Roselle. Although the collection includes correspondence of William Haldeman dating to 1833, and letters to Alice DeLoach in 1961, most items fall within the period 1868-1941, from the marriage of Anna Haldeman and John H. Addams to the death of Marcet Haldeman-Julius.

The collection has two important features. First, it provides a family perspective on the life of Jane Addams, whose childhood, early years, and eventual achievements are seen in the context of her family relationships. She appears frequently as "Jennie" or "Aunt Jane" in the diaries and correspondence of other family members, and her correspondence with them spans the period 1888-1929. A second feature of the collection is its detailed information on the marriage and professional careers of Emanuel and Marcet Haldeman-Julius, who operated the Haldeman-Julius Publishing Company in Girard, Kansas. This press, successor to William Wayland's, "Appeal to Reason," issued a variety of publications including The Debunker, The Haldeman-Julius Monthly, and the Little Blue Books. Emanuel was editor of the Haldeman-Julius publications, which reflected his socialist convictions and rationalist attitudes. His writing brought him into contact with such prominent literary and social critics of the day as H.L. Mencken and Upton Sinclair. The Little Blue Books series was his attempt to place important literature in the hands of the general public. Selling for five cents each, the books measured 3 1/2 x 5 inches and had blue covers. Although the format allowed no more than 15,000 words, subjects ranged from abridgements of classic novels to self-improvement manuals. Popular too, were a number of works under such general titles as "French Love Stories." In contrast to the erratic publishing schedules of some of the Haldeman-Julius magazines, the Little Blue Books were a regular part of the press from 1919 until Emanuel's death in 1951.

Marcet wrote articles and columns for the various Haldeman-Julius publications and reported a number of famous court cases, among them the Scopes, Tom Mooney, and Rev. Frank Norris trials. Although her education and her early careers in the theater and in banking did not presage it, Marcet became active in socialist causes in the 1920's and 1930's. She travelled to the Soviet Union in 1931-1932 to report on the status of the Russian Revolution for "The American Freeman." In addition, she wrote short stories for the Atlantic Monthly, and collaborated with Emanuel on the novel Dust and Violence. In the 1930's she did numerous articles and short stories with John W. Gunn, a writer for the Haldeman-Julius press. The collection is rich in material on all aspects of Marcet's life and provides an interesting look at the intellectual currents in the Midwest during the period between the two World Wars.

The history of the Haldeman, Addams, and Haldeman-Julius families involves many strong individuals. Some, like Jane Addams, had national impact, but almost all were very influential in their communities. John H. Addams was a prominent figure in Illinois politics and a friend of Abraham Lincoln. After his death, Anna H. Addams ruled the Cedarville Homestead and farms for thirty-eight years. Her son, Henry W. Haldeman, served as Mayor of Girard, Kansas, and president of the State Bank of Girard, a position assumed by S. Alice Haldeman on his death in 1905. Even the lesser known members of the family such as George B. Haldeman and J. Weber Addams were distinct personalities. Therefore, the collection was organized to provide the greatest amount of information about each member of the family. The material was closely grouped around the following persons:

Anna Hostetter Haldeman Addams (1828-1919) Wife of William Haldeman (1847-1866), and of John Huey Addams 1868-1881; mother of Henry W. Haldeman and George B. Haldeman, stepmother of Jane Addams; lived in Cedarville Homestead 1868-1919 and was cared for in her later years by Mary Fry.

Jane Addams (1860-1935) Daughter of John Huey and Sarah Weber Addams; educated at Rockford College, Rockford, Illinois; founder of Hull-House, Chicago, Illinois, 1889, and leader of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom.

John Huey Addams (1822-1881) Father of Jane Addams; prominent miller in Cedarville, Illinois, and a member of the state legislature.

John Weber Addams (1853-1918) Brother of Jane Addams; husband of Laura Shoemaker Addams, father of Sarah Addams Young; educated at Beloit College, Wisconsin; inheritor of John H. Addams' mill; confined to several Illinois mental hospitals, in one of which he died.

Alice Haldeman-Julius DeLoach (1917-) Daughter of Emanuel and Marcet Haldeman-Julius.

George Bowman Haldeman (1861-1909) Son of Anna and William Haldeman; stepbrother and childhood companion of Jane Addams; educated at Beloit College, Wisconsin, and John Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland; recluse at Cedarville Homestead c. 1889 until his death.

Henry Julius Haldeman (1919-) Son of Emanuel and Marcet Haldeman-Julius. Changed form of his name from Henry Haldeman-Julius to the above.

Henry Winfield Haldeman (1848-1905) Son of Anna and William Haldeman; stepbrother of Jane Addams; husband of Sarah Alice Addams Haldeman; father of Marcet Haldeman-Julius; educated at Leipzig University, Germany; physician and banker; Mayor of Girard, Kansas.

Sarah Alice Addams Haldeman (1853-1915) Daughter of John Huey and Sarah Weber Addams; wife of Henry Winfield Haldeman; mother of Marcet Haldeman-Julius; educated at Rockford Seminary, Rockford, Illinois; president of State Bank of Girard, Kansas, 1905-1915.

(Anna) Marcet Haldeman-Julius (1887-1941) Daughter of S. Alice and Henry W. Haldeman, wife of Emanuel Haldeman-Julius; mother of Alice and Henry; educated at Ft. Dearborn Seminary, Chicago, Illinois, Bryn Mawr College, Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, New York [New York] Drama School; actress 1910-1915; president of State Bank of Girard, Kansas, and secretary of the Kansas State Bankers Association 1915-1916; author and co-author of numerous articles, essays, short stories, and novels including an unpublished fictionalized account of the life of Anna H. Addams, Immortal Garland.

Mary Catherine Addams Linn (1847-1894) Daughter of John Huey and Sarah Weber Addams; wife of Rev. John M. Linn; mother of Stanley, James Weber and John Addams Linn and Esther Linn Hulbert.

Josephine [Wettstein] Haldeman-Julius Roselle (1910-) Adopted daughter of Emanuel and Marcet Haldeman-Julius; companionate wife of Aubrey Roselle 1927- .

The collection includes general business and personal correspondence, 1933-1961; diaries, 1872-1930; notebooks; postal, greeting and calling cards; genealogy charts; theatre programs and souvenirs; address lists; legal and financial papers pertaining to farm properties in Cedarville, Illinois, and Girard, Kansas, to the State Bank of Girard, Kansas, and to the New Appeal and the Haldeman-Julius Publishing Companies, 1894-1937; photographs; clippings, 1903-1961; and miscellaneous published works by Emanuel and Marcet Haldeman-Julius and others, 1909-1950.

When received, the collection was unarranged; the cataloger adopted the following system. Published material and photographs were removed and filed alphabetically according to title. Correspondence, the bulk of the collection, was first grouped according to the person to whom it pertained. Business correspondence was filed under the name of the family member involved with appropriate sub-headings. For example, papers on Marcet's farms are filed:

Haldeman-Julius, Marcet - Business Correspondence - Farm Properties

April, 1916 - May, 1925

and general business correspondence appears:

Haldeman-Julius, Marcet - Business Correspondence

January, 1915 - May, 1916

Personal correspondence is handled as follows. Letters between members of the Haldeman, Addams, and Haldeman-Julius families are filed under the writer's name with a sub-heading indicating the person addressed. For example, letters written by Marcet to Emanuel are filed:

Marcet Haldeman-Julius - Personal Correspondence - to Emanuel Haldeman-Julius

December, 1915 - August, 1939

and letters from Emanuel to Marcet are filed:

Emanuel Haldeman-Julius - Personal Correspondence - to Marcet Haldeman-Julius

All other personal correspondence follows this system: Letters to and from regular correspondents of a family member are filed under that individual's name, with an appropriate sub-heading. Thus the folder:

Marcet Haldeman-Julius - Personal Correspondence - Ruth Jones Argens
November, 1915 - December, 1915

includes all letters sent and received by Marcet and Ruth Argens for the period. Letters from famous persons are also filed under the name of the family member correspondent. Thus the folder:

Emanuel Haldeman-Julius - Personal Correspondence - Eugene V. Debs
October, 1924

contains a letter to Emanuel from Debs, and the folder titled:

Marcet Haldeman-Julius - Personal Correspondence - Mary Rozet Smith
April, 1915 - February, 1961

includes letters to and from Marcet and Mary Rozet Smith for the period. Readers are alerted to the presence of such letters by subject entries in the card catalogue, where important letters have individual description cards. All other personal correspondence is grouped as miscellaneous. Thus the folder:

Anna H. Addams - Personal Correspondence - Miscellaneous
1866 - 1915

includes all letters to and from Anna H. Addams and her distant relatives, friends, and acquaintances. All material in correspondence files is arranged chronologically with the earliest date appearing first. Letter fragments were identified by handwriting and content and filed according to general date. To locate any particular letter, first establish which member of the family is involved; next, whether it is a business or personal letter; then, what person or subject is involved, and finally, what date.

A final note; Genealogy tables accompanying this Guide were prepared by the cataloger. Tables filed under "Genealogy and Family History" were part of the collection and were usually prepared by Marcet Haldeman-Julius.

Haldeman-Julius Family Papers – Supplement 1

The papers of Supplement 1 contain personal correspondence and business papers of the Haldeman-Julius family as well as pamphlets published by Emanuel Haldeman-Julius. They were received in four installments between 1981 and 1983, and measure 9.75 in. ft. Supplement 1 comprises accession numbers 81-2, 82 -68, 83-52 and 83-53. The papers were divided into categories by the accessioner for ease of access. These categories include: letters from family members to Anna Hostetter Haldeman Addams, estate and business papers of the William Haldeman, business papers of Anna Hostetter Haldeman Addams, and material pertaining to Hull-House.

Finally, the supplement includes booklets published by the Haldeman-Julius Company, the socialist publishing house owned by Emanuel Haldeman-Julius. These are duplicate pamphlets from the Louise Hulbert Smith Collection. A complete set of the Haldeman-Julius pamphlets can be found in Acc # 74-26. Many of the items in this collection are very fragile. As a result, items marked with an asterisk (*) may not be photocopied due to preservation concerns.
