Pediatrics	NBME Subject Exam	60	Student status is pending ; continues to next clerkship; retakes exam during next make-up exam period (December, June or August**) or comparable exam as determined by program director.	Student receives an Unsatisfactory grade and must retake the clerkship in its entirety. Student must satisfy all clinical clerkship requirements; the clinical grade earned on the repeat will be used to calculate the final grade, but it can not exceed the initial clinical grade earned.	Student is recommended to be dismissed from the College for poor scholarship.
Psychiatry	NBME Subject Exam Standardized Clinical Exam	60 P / F	Student status is pending ; continues to next clerkship; retakes exam during next make-up exam period (December, June, or August**). Results of the Clinical Exam constitute 33% of the clinical grade. Unsatisfactory performance would necessitate satisfactory completion of specific remedial activities.	Student receives an Unsatisfactory grade and must retake the clerkship in its entirety. Student must satisfy all clinical clerkship requirements; the clinical grade earned on the repeat will be used to calculate the final grade, but it can not exceed the initial clinical grade earned.	Student is recommended to be dismissed from the College for poor scholarship.
Surgery	NBME Subject Exam	60	Student status is pending ; continues to next clerkship. Student must meet with Clerkship Director to develop study plan and retake exam during next make-up exam period (December, June or August**).	Student receives an Unsatisfactory grade and must retake the clerkship in its entirety. Student must satisfy all clinical clerkship requirements; the clinical grade earned on the repeat will be used to calculate the final grade, but it can not exceed the initial clinical grade earned.	Student is recommended to be dismissed from the College for poor scholarship.
