

Summer Academic Learning Community

The Summer Academic Learning Community (SALC) at the University of Illinois at Chicago is a collaboration between the TRIO/Academic Support Program (TRIO/ASP) and the African American Academic Network (AAAN). The Summer Academic Learning Community gives you the opportunity to participate in a summer experience that will help you develop the academic, leadership, critical thinking, math, writing, and coping skills you will need to transition successfully from high school to college with success. This is a summer pre-college experience that will help build a bond between you and the university community, making the experience less intimidating.

SALC is a five week program (June 26- July 31, 2009) that makes a lifetime of difference for its participants. Although it does not offer academic credit, successful students who take part in the outstanding college-level skill building workshops have the opportunity to:

- Increase their writing skills and feel confident about their ability to write at the level expected of a first-year college student, in addition to having the opportunity to complete English Portfolios required in the regular first year English courses.
- Potentially advance to a higher level course in mathematics prior to the fall 2009 semester by retaking the placement exam.

Program Eligibility

- First generation and/or low income students.
- Students registered with UIC Disability Service

Cost: There is no cost or registration fee.

Program Size: The Program will accommodate 50 students on a first-come- first served-basis?
