

Chancellor's Status Committee Membership Guidelines

Committee Membership Guidelines for the Chancellor's Status Committees

In efforts to support the continued effectiveness of the Chancellor's Status Committees, Membership Guidelines are as follows:

- The Office for Access and Equity will provide administrative support to the committees and will serve as the chancellor's liaison to them
- Following their various by-laws and procedures, committees will submit their lists of nominations, including a recommendation for co-chairs, to the Office for Access and Equity by May 1st. By June 1st the new committees will be named, but the change-over will not take effect until July 1st
- Committees will nominate 20 or more persons for membership, creating a roster from which the Chancellor will appointment 14 members, including two-chairs
- Committees will take upon themselves the effort to attend to demographic issues such as location(east/west campus), status (faculty/academic professional/civil service staff/student), gender and turn over
- The Chancellor may nonetheless see a need to appoint one or more persons who are not on the list of committee nominations. In those cases, the Chancellor will discuss that decision in advance with the co-chairs
- Following their various by-laws, committees will elect their co-chairs, attending in the process to the requirement that one co-chair be faculty and the other staff and to the need to change leadership with co-chairs serving no more than two consecutive years
- Where there is a relevant cultural center, the Director of the center will be added to the committee as an additional full (not ex officio) member.
- Directors of support-service offices will be added as ex-officio
- Non-Members should be encouraged to participate on all subcommittees
