## **2012 Freshman Application Deadline**

Freshmen may apply for Fall semester (August) admission only. Applications and all supporting materials must be postmarked by January 15, 2012.

## **Save Time - Apply Online** **[www.admissions.uic.edu/apply](http://www.admissions.uic.edu/apply)**

Online applications are processed faster than paper applications. If you apply online, be sure to send us your official transcripts, test scores, and any other required application materials together in one envelope to the UIC Office of Admissions by January 15. You may pay your application fee online by using a major credit card, such as Mastercard, VISA, Discover, American Express; send your application fee by check or money order; or submit an application fee waiver to the UIC Office of Admissions. If you apply online **do not** submit a paper application.

## **Who Should Use This Application**

This is an application for beginning freshmen for Fall 2012 only.

As a beginning freshman applicant you must:

- Currently attend high school or have graduated from high school and have never attended a college or university after graduating high school.
- Be at least 16 years of age and be a graduate of an accredited high school or submit passing scores on the GED test. Students enrolled in a home school program should call the UIC Office of Admissions at (312) 996-4350 for more information.
- Complete the ACT or the SAT.
- Satisfy the minimum high school subject requirements (see page 3).

## **Who Should Not Use This Application**

- Transfer, readmission, non-degree, and second bachelor's degree applicants - please use the transfer application at [www.admissions.uic.edu/apply](http://www.admissions.uic.edu/apply).
- Currently enrolled UIC undergraduates - if you wish to transfer to a different UIC college you must contact the college to which you wish to transfer for instructions.
- Applicants seeking enrollment as a non-degree student for the Summer Session Only - you may obtain information and an application at [www.summer.uic.edu](http://www.summer.uic.edu) or by calling (312) 996-9099.

## Application Review and Decision Notification

The Office of Admissions will review your application only after we receive your completed, signed application, the appropriate application fee, and all required additional materials as listed in the application instructions. You may track the status of your application online at: [www.admissions.uic.edu/status](http://www.admissions.uic.edu/status).

UIC uses a holistic approach during the application review process. The application evaluation includes a review of multiple factors, including, but not limited to, high school coursework and cumulative grade point average, grade trend, grades in required high school courses, course levels, such as, Honors, AP, IB, etc., class rank, ACT or SAT scores, and personal statement. Additional factors that may be considered are college readiness, writing proficiency, quantitative reasoning, critical thinking, and preparedness for the major. Admission is competitive, and selection depends on space availability and the overall applicant pool.

Freshman decision letters will be sent between November and March.

## Completing This Application

Read the following instructions carefully. Not following instructions may cause significant delays in the processing of your application.

- All questions on the application must be completed unless indicated as optional.
- To complete your application you must submit the following to the UIC Office of Admissions:
  - 2012 Freshman Application.
  - Application fee or application fee waiver.
  - Official transcripts from all high schools attended.
  - Official scores from the ACT or the SAT. See UIC codes listed on back cover.
  - Personal Statement.
  - Students who have completed the GED in lieu of completing high school must send official scores from the GED test.
  - Students enrolled in high school in a country where English is not the only official language must prove English competency by submitting official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Please refer to page 6 for further information about the test if this applies to you.
  - Application Checklist.
- All transcripts, test scores, and other required documents must be official.  
A transcript is considered official if:
  - It is submitted by you as part of your self-managed application and is in an envelope marked "issued to student" and sealed by the issuing school, college or university. Do not open your sealed transcript.
  - It is mailed, faxed, or electronically submitted directly from the records office at your high school to UIC's Office of Admissions.

**Unofficial copies will not be accepted.**
- If you are currently enrolled at a college or university while attending high school, you must send a final official transcript to UIC when coursework is completed.
- If you are a domestic applicant and have educational credentials from outside of the United States, follow the Instructions for International Applicants on pages 6 and 7, with the exception of evidence of financial support.
- If you are an international applicant, see pages 6 and 7 for additional instructions and requirements.
- Your application will not be processed without your application fee or application fee waiver. Enclose a check or money order drawn on a U.S. bank payable to "University of Illinois at Chicago" with your name and date of birth listed exactly as it appears on your application. The nonrefundable application fee is \$50 for all freshman applicants. Do not send cash through the mail.

8. All documents submitted to UIC for admission review purposes become property of the University. These documents will not be released to students or forwarded to other educational institutions or agencies.
9. Use of your legal name: In order to ensure quick and accurate processing of your application, always use your legal name when contacting or submitting documents to the University. For domestic students, your name must match name on your social security card; for international students, your name must match your passport information.
10. Use of your Social Security Number (SSN): Your social security number is not required for admission to the University; however, by providing it, you will help us to match your application materials. **Your SSN is required if you are applying for federal financial aid.** The University is committed to ensuring the privacy and confidentiality of student records and will not disclose your SSN without your consent for any purpose except as allowed by law.
11. Use of your email address: UIC sends official University communications through email. Please provide a valid email address and notify the Office of Admissions if your email address changes.
12. If you are an official permanent resident of the United States or you have been granted temporary residence, conditional entrance, parolee, refugee, or asylum status, or you are in the process of becoming a permanent resident, attach a clear photocopy of the front and back of your Permanent Resident Card and/or other appropriate United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) documentation. We may require additional documentation.
13. This application is only valid for the term for which you are applying. If you do not enroll for that term and decide to apply for another term you will have to submit another complete application, application fee, and supporting materials.
14. This is a self-managed application. It is preferred that you submit all of your application materials with your application to the UIC Office of Admissions in one envelope rather than sending them separately.

## Recommended High School Subjects

For application review, all applicants should have successfully completed or have in progress the following high school courses in order to be eligible for admission to UIC.

- Four years of English
- Three to four years of mathematics\*
- Three years of science
- Three years of social science
- Two years of a language other than English

\*Should include algebra, geometry, advanced algebra/trigonometry

## Instructions for International Applicants

International applicant: anyone who is or will be on any type of visa while in the U.S.

Applicants requesting an F-1 or J-1 visa must apply for full-time degree-seeking status. Applicants admitted to UIC will receive written notification and an official document (I-20 or DS 2019) to be processed when requesting their visa to enter the U.S.

Carefully read and follow the application instructions and requirements listed under **Completing This Application**. In addition, please make sure to carefully read this entire section and follow the directions.

Your application will be reviewed after the Office of Admissions has received the following:

- Completed and signed application.
- Non-refundable \$50 application fee.
- Evidence of English competency.
- Required Educational Credentials.
- English Translation of Academic Credentials, if necessary.

### Non-Refundable \$50 Application Fee

You may send a bank draft or money order in US currency, or personal check drawn on a U.S. bank made payable to the “University of Illinois at Chicago.” Your name, as it appears on your application, must be written on the draft, money order, or check. Foreign money orders should include full routing information for processing to the correct account. The application fee cannot be waived or deferred regardless of the currency restrictions imposed by some countries. You may also pay your application fee online by using a major credit card such as Mastercard, VISA, Discover, or American Express.

### Evidence of English Competency

- All international applicants are required to submit official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), unless they meet the TOEFL exemptions listed below.
- The TOEFL must have been taken within the last two years.
- Minimum score required: paper-based TOEFL = 550, computer based TOEFL = 213, Internet-based TOEFL = 80.
- Individual UIC colleges may require higher scores.

TOEFL contact information: Visit [www.toefl.org](http://www.toefl.org) or write to The Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey 80540. Call 1-800-GO-TOEFL (toll-free within the U.S. only). UIC’s test code is 1851. In lieu of TOEFL, you may submit an IELTS score. Minimum score required is 6.5.

### TOEFL Exemptions

- Non-native English speakers who have completed two consecutive years of full-time high school in the U.S. or another country where the only official language of the country is English.
- Native English speakers from countries where English is the only official language.

### **Required Educational Credentials**

If you have studied outside the United States, you must submit all required official academic credentials from all high schools attended, including:

- A list of all subjects/courses studied for each year.
- Grades or examination results received (failing as well as passing) in each subject/course.
- Maximum and minimum grades obtainable for each course.
- Degree certificates/diplomas awarded, if applicable.

These credentials should be submitted in the same packet with your application and application fee. If you must submit transcripts or any other documentation separately, be sure to include your name and address as it appears on your application, and your date of birth (and U.S. Social Security Number, if applicable) on each document in a sealed envelope issued by the school.

**Transcripts:** International applicants who have attended high schools that issue official transcripts on request should submit their transcripts. A certified English translation must be attached if the transcript is not in English. Official transcripts bear the seal and/or stamp of the high school as well as the signature of the appropriate official on both the transcript and on the seal of the envelope.

**Marksheets:** Applicants from countries that issue marksheets, such as India, should submit attested or certified marksheets showing the detailed results of all exams taken. Marksheets should be attested by the Controller of Examinations, Registrar, or Attestations Officer. A certified English translation should be attached to any credential not issued in English. Consolidated marks will not be accepted. Official marksheets bear the seal and/or stamp of the high school as well as the signature of the school official on both the marksheets and on the seal of the envelope.

### **English Translations of Academic Credentials**

Official English translations must accompany all academic credentials originally issued in a language other than English. Evaluations from credit evaluation services, such as ECE/WES not accepted in lieu of transcripts/marksheets. Official credentials should be sent in the original language and accompanied by a verbatim (word for word) English translation, in the identical format of the original credential. Interpretive translations are not acceptable. To find a certified translator, we recommend searching [www.atanet.org](http://www.atanet.org).

### **Evidence of Financial Support**

Evidence of financial support for the first year of study must be submitted before an I-20 for an F-1 visa or DS-2019 for a J-1 visa will be sent to the admitted student.

- 1) An original bank statement signed by a bank official.
- 2) The UIC Declaration and Certification of Finances Form.
