If you apply online do not submit a paper application.

Who Should Use This Application

- **Transfer applicants:** You are a transfer applicant if you have attended another college or university after graduating from high school. If you are currently enrolled at the University of Illinois at Springfield or the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, you are considered a transfer applicant.
- **Readmission applicants:** You are a readmission applicant if you have previously registered at UIC as an undergraduate degree candidate and either (a) earned credit but did not graduate, (b) with drew after the first day of the term for which you were admitted, or (c) have an academic record at UIC but did not graduate (see page 4).
- **Second bachelor's degree applicants:** You are a second bachelor's degree applicant if you have already been awarded a bachelor's degree and wish to pursue a second bachelor's degree (see page 4).
- **Non-degree applicants:** You are a non-degree applicant if you do not wish to enroll in a degree program at UIC but wish to take courses for credit (see page 4).
- **International transfer applicants:** You are an international applicant if you are a citizen or permanent resident of a country or political area other than the United States, you have a residence outside the United States to which you expect to return, and you are, or propose to be, a temporary resident in the United States for educational purposes (see pages 4–6).

Who Should Not Use This Application

- **Freshman applicants** (please use Freshman Application). You are a freshman applicant if you have not enrolled in any college courses since graduating from high school. You can obtain information and an application at www.oar.uic.edu/apply or by calling (312) 996-4350.

Application Review and Decision Notification

Applications will be reviewed when the Office of Admissions has received all required application materials. UIC uses a holistic approach during the application review process. The application process includes a review of multiple factors, including, but not limited to, courses taken, credit hours earned and grade point average of all baccalaureate-oriented, college-level work attempted. Additional factors that may be considered are writing proficiency, quantitative reasoning, critical thinking, and preparedness for the major. Admission is competitive and selection for admission depends on space limitations and the overall applicant pool.

Transfer decision letters will be sent between February and May for Fall enrollment and between October and November for Spring enrollment.

Completing This Application

- 1 Read the instructions for your applicant type carefully (see pages 1 and 4). Not following instructions can cause significant delays in the processing of your application. All questions are required unless indicated as optional.
- 2 This is a self-managed application. It is preferred that you submit all of your application materials in one envelope. To complete your application you must submit the following to the UIC Office of Admissions:
 - Completed Application.
 - Application Fee or Fee Waiver.
 - Personal Statement (Recommended).
 - Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
 - Application Checklist.
- 3 All transcripts, test scores and other required documents must be official. A transcript is considered official if:
 - It is submitted by you as part of your self-managed application and is in an envelope marked “issued to student” and sealed by the issuing school, college, or university. Do not open your sealed transcript.

Unofficial copies will not be accepted.

- 4 All documents submitted to UIC for admission review purposes become property of the University. They will not be released to students or forwarded to other educational institutions or agencies. Your application will not be processed without your application fee or a fee waiver. Enclose a check or money order drawn on a U.S. bank payable to “University of Illinois at Chicago” with your name listed exactly as it appears on your application and list your date of birth. The nonrefundable application fee for U.S. citizen, permanent resident, other non-citizen, and international applicants is \$50. (Refer to the UIC definition of an international applicant on page 1). Do not send cash through the mail.
- 5 Use of your Social Security Number (SSN): Your social security number is not required for admission to the University; however, by providing it, you will help us to match your application materials. The University is committed to ensuring the privacy and confidentiality of student records and will not disclose your SSN without your consent for any purpose except as allowed by law.
- 6 Use of your official name: In order to ensure quick and accurate processing of your application, always use your official name when contacting or submitting documents to the University. For domestic students, name must match name on social security card; for international students, name must match passport information.
- 7 If you are an official permanent resident of the United States or you have been granted temporary residence, conditional entrance, parolee, refugee, or asylum status, or you are in the process of becoming a permanent resident, attach a clear photocopy of the front and back of your Permanent Resident Card and/or other appropriate United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) documentation. We may require additional documentation.
- 8 This application is only valid for the term for which you are applying. If you do not enroll for that term and decide to apply for another term you will have to submit an other complete application, application fee, and your supporting materials.
- 9 If you are an international applicant, see pages 4–6 for additional instructions and requirements.
- 10 If you are a domestic applicant and have educational credentials from outside of the United States, follow the Instructions for International Applicants on pages 4–6, with the exception of evidence of financial support.
- 11 If you are currently enrolled at a college or university, you must send a final official transcript to UIC when coursework is completed.

Readmission applicants

Include your official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended since your last term at UIC. If you are on probationary or drop status with UIC and are requesting readmission, attach a letter of petition to this application explaining the reasons for previous scholastic deficiencies, steps taken to rectify deficiencies, and any new evidence demonstrating potential for success at UIC. No application fee is required if you were previously enrolled as a degree-seeking undergraduate student at UIC.

Second bachelor's degree applicants

See **Transfer Admission Requirements** to complete this application. Second bachelor's degree applicants must meet all regular admission requirements. You must submit a letter of petition explaining the reasons you are seeking second bachelor's degree admission. **The College of Education and the College of Business Administration do not accept second bachelor's degree applications.** Other colleges will give priority in admission and registration to students seeking their first bachelor's degree when space in the entering class is limited. Second bachelor's degree students are not eligible for most financial aid.

Non-degree applicants

See **Transfer Admission Requirements** to complete this application. Acceptance of a student in non-degree status is at the discretion of the dean of the college to which the student is applying. Non-degree applicants must meet all regular admission requirements and must submit a letter of petition. Some colleges do not admit or may have special admission requirements for non-degree applicants. Priority in admission and registration is given to degree-seeking students. International students on an F-1 or J-1 visa may not enroll as non-degree students. Non-degree students are not eligible for financial aid.

Instructions for International Applicants

• **International applicant:** anyone who is or will be on any type of visa while in the U.S.

Applicants requesting an F-1 or J-1 visa must apply for full-time degree-seeking status. Applicants admitted to UIC will receive written notification and an official document (I-20 or DS 2019) to be processed when requesting their visa to enter the United States.

Carefully read and follow the application instructions and requirements listed under **Completing This Application** and **Transfer Admission Requirements**. In addition, please make sure to carefully read this entire section and follow the directions.

Your application will be reviewed after the Office of Admissions has received the following:

- Completed and signed application
- Non-refundable \$50 application fee
- Evidence of English competency
- Required Educational Credentials
- Official English translation for all academic credentials not originally issued in English
- The application checklist.

Non-Refundable \$50 Application Fee

You may send a bank draft or money order in US currency, or personal check drawn on a US bank made payable to the "University of Illinois at Chicago." Your name, as it appears on your application, must be written on the draft, money order, or check. Foreign money orders should include full routing information for processing to the correct account. The application fee cannot be waived or deferred regardless of the currency restrictions imposed by some countries.

Evidence of English Competency

All international applicants are required to submit official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), unless they meet the TOEFL exemptions listed below. The TOEFL must have been taken within the last two years. Minimum score required: paper-based TOEFL = 550, computer based TOEFL = 213, Internet-based TOEFL = 80. Individual UIC colleges may require higher scores. TOEFL contact information: Visit www.toefl.org or write to The Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey 80540. Call 1-800-GO-TOEFL (toll-free within the U.S. only). UIC's test code is 1851. In lieu of TOEFL, you may submit an IELTS score. Minimum score required is 6.5.

TOEFL Exemptions

- 1) Non-native English speakers who have completed two consecutive years of full-time high school or university study (minimum 12 semester hours per term) in the U.S. or another country where the only official language of the country is English.
- 2) Non-native English speakers who have a minimum of one year full-time employment in the U.S. or other country where the only official language of the country is English. Applicants must submit a letter from their employer verifying at least 12 consecutive months of employment and describing their English language ability.
- 3) Native English speakers from countries where English is the only official language.

Required Educational Credentials

If you have studied outside the United States, you must submit all required official academic credentials from all universities attended, including:

- A list of all subjects/courses studied for each year.
- Grades or examination results received (failing as well as passing) in each subject/course.
- Maximum and minimum grades obtainable for each course.
- Degree certificates/diplomas awarded, if applicable.

These credentials should be submitted in the same packet with your application and application fee. If you must submit transcripts or any other documentation separately, be sure to include your name and address as it appears on your application, and your date of birth (and US Social Security Number, if applicable) on each document. All academic documents must be submitted in a sealed envelope bearing the same signature and university seal as the document itself.

Transcripts: International applicants who have attended universities that issue official transcripts on request should submit their transcripts. A certified English translation must be attached if the transcript is not in English. Official transcripts bear the seal and/or stamp of the university as well as the signature of the appropriate University official, such as the Registrar.

Marksheets: Applicants from countries that issue marksheets, such as India, should submit attested or certified marksheets showing the detailed results of all exams taken. Marksheetwork should be attested by the Controller of Examinations, Registrar, or Attestations Officer. A certified English translation should be attached to any credential not issued in English. Consolidated marks will not be accepted.

Official Syllabus in English: If you are applying to the College of Engineering, an official syllabus in English from each university attended fully describing all course work attempted, must be submitted at the time of application. A syllabus may be required of other applicants on a case-by-case basis. All other applicants who are admitted must bring their syllabus to their college office when they come for academic advising.

Special note to Nursing Applicants: You may submit a Full Education Course-by-Course Report evaluation of foreign credit along with your official transcripts. The report is available from the Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing Schools. You may request an application from the UIC College of Nursing, Office of Academic Programs, at (312) 996-7800 or at www.cgfn.org.

English Translations of Academic Credentials

Official English translations must accompany all academic credentials originally issued in a language other than English. ECE/WES not accepted in lieu of transcripts/marksheets. Official credentials should be sent in the original language and accompanied by a verbatim (word for word) English translation, in the identical format of the original credential. Interpretive translations are not acceptable. To find a certified translator, we recommend searching www.atanet.org or contacting Josef Silny & Associates, Inc. at www.jsilny.com.

Evidence of Financial Support

Evidence of financial support for the first year of study must be submitted before an I-20 for an F-1 visa or DS-2019 for a J-1 visa will be sent to the admitted student.

Admitted students must submit the following items directly to the Office of International Services:

- 1) An original bank statement signed by a bank official.
- 2) The UIC Declaration and Certification of Finances Form.

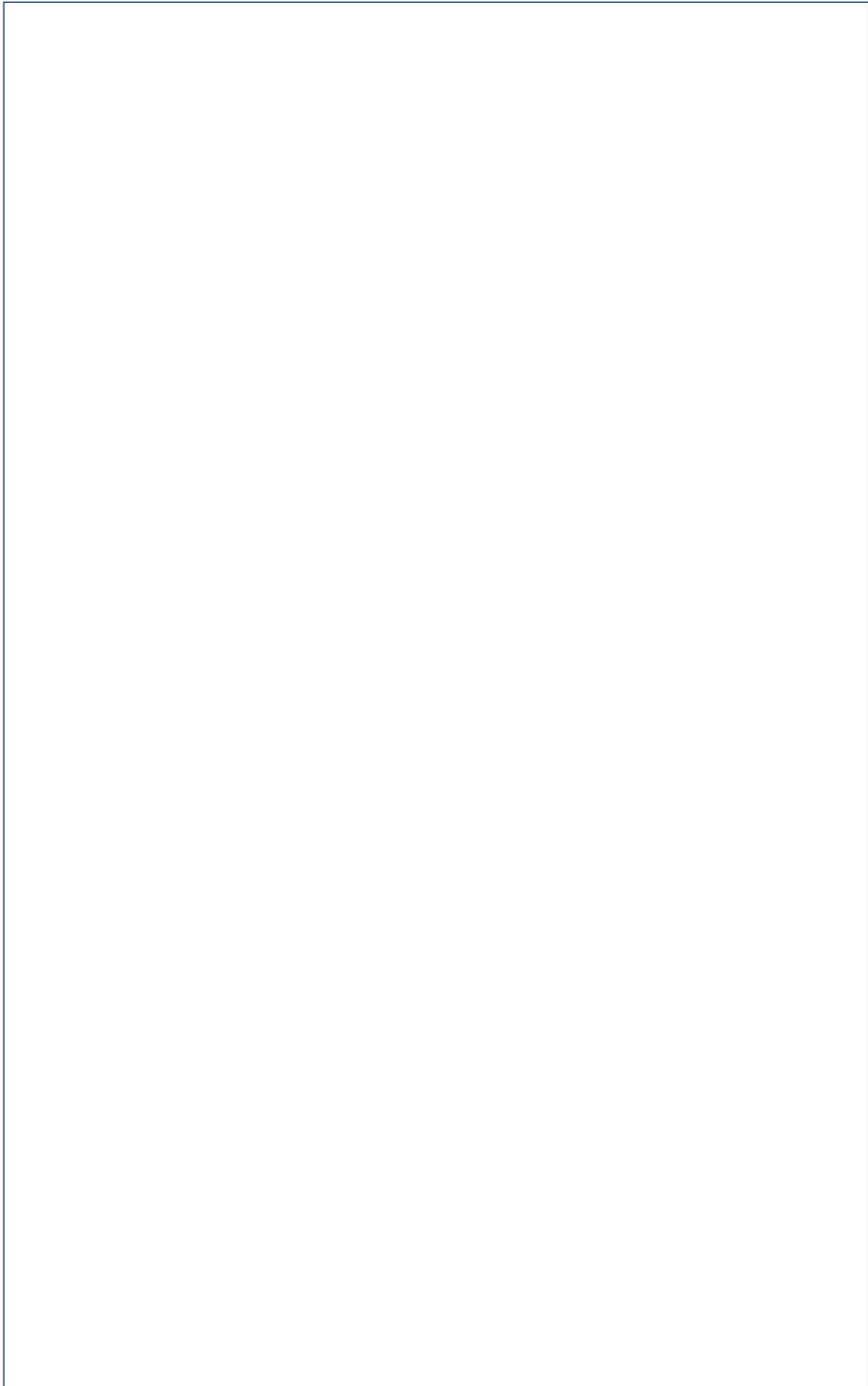

Supplemental application materials are required for Nutrition and Health Information Management.

Contact the College of Applied Health Sciences at 312-996-2079 and request your supplemental application materials. Supplemental materials must be submitted directly to the College of Applied Health Sciences by the deadline.

Nutrition Requirements: 1) Applicants may apply for Fall only; 2) Non-degree applications not accepted; 3) Second bachelor's degree students may apply; 4) Transfer students applying must have completed 60 hours (90 quarter) hours and specific prerequisite coursework, have a minimum 2.5/4.0 cumulative, science and prerequisite GPA. Coursework required at time of application: 3 of 6 required science courses with labs (General Biology I, Microbiology, General Chemistry I and II, Organic Chemistry, and Biochemistry), English Composition I (3 hours). Coursework required at time of enrollment: Consult the Department of Kinesiology and Nutrition, the department web site, or the UIC Undergraduate Catalog—www.uic.edu/ucats/catalog—for specific requirements. Note that the deadline for Nutrition is January 15.

Health Information Management Requirements: 1) Campus students: Fall application only, minimum 2.0/4.0 GPA; 2) Second bachelor's degree students may apply to the campus program, or may also consider the online IBHE Post-baccalaureate certificate in HIM—see <http://www.uic.edu/gcat/AHHIMG-IBHE.htm> for more information; 3) Non-degree applications not accepted; 4) Junior standing, 60 semester hours (90 quarter) hours and specific prerequisite course work. Coursework required at time of application: English Composition I (3 hours), Principles of General Biology I with lab (4–5 hours). Coursework required at time of enrollment: Consult the Department of Biomedical and Health Information Sciences, the department web site, or the UIC Undergraduate Catalog—<http://www.uic.edu/ucats>/catalog—www.uic.edu/ucats/catalog—for specific requirements.

Kinesiology Requirements: 1) Applicants may apply for Fall or Spring. 2) Minimum 2.5/4.0 GPA at the time of application; 3) Applicants are strongly encouraged to include a personal statement indicating why they are interested in Kinesiology and/or their career goals. These statements are very important in the admission review process. 4) Second bachelor's degree students may apply. Coursework required at time of application: English Composition I and II, Principles/General Biology I with lab (4–5) hours, Introduction to Psychology (3–4 hours), College Level Mathematics—Pre-Calculus (3–5 hours), and one course (3 hours) in three of the following four categories: Understanding the Past, Exploring World Cultures, Understanding U.S. Society, and Understanding the Creative Arts.

For Candidacy for Elementary Education concentration: (must have Junior standing, 60 semester (90 quarter) hours of specific prerequisite course work at time of entry, and a minimum 2.5/4.0 cumulative GPA for all college work completed) (1) Candidacy Application for Elementary Education; (2) documentation of 50 service learning/observation hours working with a diverse group of students in an urban educational setting; (3) Goal Statement discussing in 250–300 words in what ways you believe you possess the critical characteristics of an urban elementary teacher; (4) Two letters of recommendation (one from the supervisor of the 50 service learning/observation hours and one from a professor in a college-level class); (5) Area of Specialization Form; (6) Passing score on the ICTS Basic Skills Test; and (7) Personal interview.
