APPLICATION REVIEW AND DECISION NOTIFICATION

Applications are complete when the Office of Admissions has received **all** required application materials. Freshman decision letters will be sent between November and March. Transfer decision letters will be sent between February and May for Fall enrollment and between October and November for Spring enrollment.

Important: Selection for admission depends on space limitations and overall student demand. Meeting minimum requirements for admissions *does not* guarantee admission to the University.

COMPLETING THIS APPLICATION

- 1 Read the instructions for your applicant type carefully (see pages 3 & 4). Not following instructions can cause significant delays in the processing of your application. All questions are required unless indicated as optional. UIC now requires all freshmen to submit a personal statement (page 9).
- 2 This is a self-managed application. Submit all of your application materials in one envelope – application, application fee, application checklist, personal statement, transcripts, etc.
- 3 If you are an official permanent resident of the United States or you have been granted temporary residence, conditional entrance, parolee, refugee, or asylum status, or you are in the process of becoming a permanent resident, attach a clear photocopy of the front and back of your Permanent Resident Card and/or other appropriate INS documentation. We may require additional documentation.
- 4 This application is only valid for the term for which you are applying. If you do not enroll for that term and decide to apply for another term you will have to submit another complete application and application fee and update your supporting materials.
- 5 All transcripts, test scores and other required documents must be original or official copies. Unofficial copies are not acceptable. All documents submitted to UIC for admission review purposes become property of the University. They will not be released to students or forwarded to other educational institutions or agencies.

- 6 **Your application will not be processed unless it includes your application fee or a fee waiver.** Enclose a check or money order drawn on a U.S. bank payable to University of Illinois with your name listed exactly as it appears on your application. Include your SSN and/or your date of birth. The nonrefundable application fee for U.S. citizen, permanent resident and other non-citizen applicants is \$40. The fee for international applicants is \$50. (Refer to the Instructions for International Applicants section for the UIC definition of an international applicant). Do not send cash through the mail.
- 7 You must submit **official transcripts** to UIC. A transcript is considered official if:
- It is submitted by you as part of your self-managed application and is in an envelope marked “issued to student” and has been sealed by the issuing school, college or university. Do not open your sealed transcript.
 - It has been mailed or faxed directly from the records office at a given high school, college or university to UIC’s Office of Admissions.
- 8 **A note about the use of your Social Security Number:** We are requesting your Social Security Number pursuant to Public Law 93-579 for the University’s system of student records as well as for compliance with federal and state reporting requirements. A Social Security Number is required if you are applying for financial aid but is not required for admission to the University. The University is committed to ensuring the privacy and confidentiality of student records and will not disclose your SSN without your consent for any purpose except as allowed by law.
- 9 **A note about using your official name when contacting or submitting documents to the university:** In order to insure quick and accurate processing of your application or other request, always use your official name as it appears on your transcripts, test scores, or other official documents.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FRESHMAN APPLICANTS

You are a beginning freshman if you currently attend high school or have graduated from high school but have never attended a college or university.

As a beginning freshman applicant you must:

- Be at least 16 years of age and be a graduate of an accredited high school or submit passing scores on the GED test. Home schooled students should call the UIC Office of Admissions at (312) 996-4350 for more information.
- Complete the American College Test (ACT) or the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or Scholastic Assessment Test-I (SAT-I).
- Have achieved a satisfactory combination of class rank and ACT or SAT test scores.
- Satisfy the minimum high school subject requirements for your specific major. These subject requirements are in compliance with Public Act 86-0954, which defines the minimum high school requirements for admission to public colleges and universities in Illinois. The minimum UIC subject requirements are listed below.

To complete your application you must:

- Include your application fee or fee waiver in the same envelope with this application packet.
- Send official transcripts from all high schools attended in the same envelope with this application.
- Send official scores from the American College Test (ACT), the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), or the Scholastic Assessment Test I (SAT-I). See UIC codes listed on back cover. Test scores listed on the high school transcripts will be accepted as official.
- Include your official GED scores in the same envelope with this application packet if you have completed the General Education Development (GED) test.
- Follow the **Instructions for International Applicants** if you have educational credentials from outside of the United States.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OTHER APPLICANT TYPES

Readmission applicants

You are a readmission applicant if you have previously registered at UIC as an undergraduate degree candidate and either (a) earned credit but did not graduate, or (b) withdrew after the tenth day of the term for which you were admitted (fifth day for summer session). Include your official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended since your last term at UIC. If you are on drop status from UIC or on probationary status with UIC and are requesting readmission, attach a letter of petition to this application explaining the reasons for previous scholastic deficiencies, steps taken to rectify deficiencies, and any new evidence demonstrating potential for success at UIC. No application fee is required if you were previously enrolled as a degree-seeking undergraduate student at UIC.

Second Bachelor's Degree applicants

You are a second bachelor's degree applicant if you have already been awarded a bachelor's degree and wish to pursue a second bachelor's degree. Use **Instructions for Transfer Applicants** to complete this application. Second bachelor's degree applicants must meet all regular admission requirements. The College of Education and the College of Business Administration do not accept second bachelor's degree applications. Second bachelor's degree students are not eligible for most financial aid.

Non-degree applicants

You are a non-degree applicant if you do not wish to enroll in a degree program at UIC but wish to take courses for credit. Non-degree students are ineligible for financial aid. Use **Instructions for Transfer Applicants** to complete this application.

Acceptance of a student in non-degree status is at the discretion of the dean of the college to which the student is applying. Non-degree applicants must meet all regular admission requirements. Some colleges do not admit or may have special admission requirements for non-degree applicants. Priority in admission and registration is given to degree-seeking students. International students on an F-1 or J-1 visa must enroll as full-time, degree-seeking students.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

Definition of an International Applicant:

- you are a citizen or permanent resident of a country or political area other than the United States
- you have a residence outside the United States to which you expect to return
- you are, or propose to be, a temporary resident in the United States for educational purposes

Student and Exchange Visitor Visas

If you plan to apply for an F-1 or J-1 visa, or if you are currently in the U.S. on an F-1 or J-1 visa, you must submit evidence of financial support for tuition, fees and living expenses for one year before UIC can issue you an I-20 or DS-2019. You must apply as a full-time, degree-seeking student.

You must submit:

- 1) An original Declaration of Finances Form (available online at www.uic.edu/depts/oar/forms/finchnge-ugrad.pdf or from the UIC Office of Admissions), or original INS Form I-134 (Affidavit of Support) executed by your sponsor, or an original affidavit of support executed by your sponsor.
- 2) An original bank statement signed by a bank official showing proof of sufficient funds (money market, savings, or certificate of deposit accounts) in U.S. dollars for one year of study at UIC. Checking accounts are not acceptable.

Upon admission, you will receive written notification and an official I-20 or DS-2019 to be used to request an F-1 student or J-1 exchange visitor visa. Because the application review process can take several weeks to several months to complete, we encourage you to apply well before the published deadline, and to submit all of your application materials together in the same envelope; failure to do so can result in processing delays.

English Language Competency

UIC requires applicants to submit scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). The minimum acceptable score for the paper-based TOEFL is 520 (the computer-based TOEFL is 190). Most programs require higher scores. The TOEFL must have been taken within two years of application. The TOEFL is not required for native English speakers.

A TOEFL waiver may be granted under the following conditions:

- You are a high school student who has just completed a minimum of two years of full-time study at the secondary (high school) level in a country where English is the only official language as well as the language of instruction.
- You are a transfer student from a college or university in a country where English is the only official language as well as the language of instruction, and you have just completed four consecutive semesters (six consecutive quarters) of 12 or more transferable semester (18 or more transferable quarter) hours each term.

Completion of English Composition I and II does not automatically qualify you for a waiver of the English language competency requirement.
