

Study Abroad Scholarships

Alliance for Global Education	Students who have been accepted into an Alliance program are eligible to apply for scholarship awards of up to \$2000 per student for the fall and spring terms and up to \$1000 per student for the summer term. Butler UIC	Awards \$1,000 to UIC students studying abroad on a Butler program. Eligibility: Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0/4.0. The award must be used towards a Butler University program. Summers are excluded. Butler University Institute for Study Abroad	Awards \$500 for summer programs, \$1,500 for semester programs, and \$2,500 for full year programs. Eligibility: Any student who applies for an IFSA-Butler program may apply for a scholarship. Financial need must be demonstrated. Center for Arabic Study Abroad (CASA)	Awards a tuition waiver, airline fare, all-expense paid tours in Cairo, and approximately a US\$360 stipend each month for living expenses and meals. For advance Arabic language study at the American University in Cairo. DAAD Undergraduate Scholarship and Study Scholarship	Offers scholarships, internships, grants and summer programs to undergraduates, graduate students, Ph.D. candidates and post-doctoral researchers for study and/or research at universities or institutes in the Federal Republic of Germany. See website for additional scholarships and programs available to students. www.daad.org Eligibility: United States or Canadian citizens enrolled full-time in a degree program or an accredited US or Canadian University. Have a well-defined study or research project that makes a stay in the Federal Republic of Germany essential. Flaherty Honors College Awards	Awards \$500-\$2000 to UIC students studying abroad. Eligibility: Must be a member of the UIC Honors College, and have a 3.25/4.0 GPA or above. An application can be attained at the UIC Study Abroad Office (502 UH) or at the Honors College.	Deadline in early October
Freeman-Asia	Provides \$3,000-\$7,000 to study abroad in one of 15 Asian countries. Seeks to encourage study abroad by American students in Asian countries. Fulbright	Provides round-trip transportation, tuition and monthly stipend for one academic year in any of over 140 countries. The applicant designs the program of study/research. Gates-Cambridge	Provides expenses for studying at Cambridge University for 1-4 years. Seeks students who hope to use their talents to improve the life circumstances of citizens in their respective countries. Gilman	Up to \$5,000 for study abroad program of any duration, up to one year. IES Abroad	IES commits up to \$1.7 million each year to scholarship programs for qualified student participating in an IES program. Several merit and need-based scholarships are available. Japan Monbukagakusho Scholarships	The Monbusho Scholarship enables foreign students from 110 different countries to study for 1-2 years in Japan. There are three scholarship categories open to U.S. citizens funded by the Monbusho: the Japanese Studies Scholarship for undergraduates to study Japanese foreign language and culture, the In-Service Training for Teachers Scholarship for pre-collegiate Japanese instructors to train in methods of teaching Japanese as a foreign language, and the Research Fellowship for post graduates. Eligibility: All 16 Japanese consulates in the U.S. are currently accepting applications and will administer interviews and a Japanese language exam to screen for qualified individuals for recommendation to the Monbusho. <p>Rhodes</p>	<p>Provides all necessary expenses for a minimum of two years of study at Oxford with the goal of preparing students for service to society.
