Study Contemporary Urban Issues in Two Great Cities: Chicago & London

PROGRAM

Lectures will be given by Chicago and London experts on contemporary urban issues in the two cities. Guest speakers in both cities and field visits in London will allow you to explore the same issues in this new national and urban context. Students complete group research projects choosing from the following topics (one group per topic): Crime and Safety, Economic Development, Education, Health and Social Services, Housing and Urban Development, and Government and Community Participation.

COURSE

This course will be listed as an Urban Planning course, UPP 420: Great Cities: London and Chicago.

CREDIT

6 semester hours of UIC credit

SPECIAL FEATURES

- Study your area of interest in London through field visits and lectures by British experts.
- Work on projects in research groups composed of graduate and undergraduate students. Students of all majors and disciplines are encouraged to apply.
- A fieldtrip outside of London is included.

ORIENTATION

During the spring semester, **three required** preparatory sessions will provide students with an introduction to various urban issues in Chicago and to the program as a whole. Sessions will be held on Fridays from 1:00 – 4:00 as follow: March 12, April 2 and April 23.

HOUSING / MEALS

IES will provide housing for students in a newly refurbished residence hall in the much sought after residential area of Chelsea. It is within walking distance of many central London attractions with excellent public transportation close by. Students are responsible for their own meals. Kitchens are located on each floor of the residence hall and are equipped with modern cooking utensils and appliances.

ELIGIBILITY

Upper-division UIC undergraduate and graduate students with an interest in urban issues who have completed at least 12 credit hours on campus and who are currently enrolled in a degree program are eligible to apply. Students must have an overall minimum UIC GPA of 2.5/ 4.0. Applications must be submitted to the Study Abroad Office on or before the deadline.

PROGRAM FEE

Program fee of \$3,780 will include the following:

- tuition (6 UIC credit hours)
- housing in central London
- bus tour of London and welcome reception
- field trips and one day trip to Oxford
- theatre performance
- £100 travel card for zone 1 and 2
- international health insurance
- farewell dinner

Additional expenses may include: airfare to London, meals, personal expenses and optional travel. All students will receive a budget with a cost breakdown from their study abroad advisor.

FINANCIAL AID

Eligible students may apply for financial aid to help cover the cost of this program. Additionally, there are several [scholarships](#) available for UIC students studying abroad.

Students must attend a First-Step meeting before applying to any study abroad program. After attending the First-Step and completing the application, please make an appointment with Irina Krymova for your advising meeting.

- ❑ Fill out general UIC Study Abroad Application
- ❑ Submit professor's letter of recommendation. Recommendation letter form included.
- ❑ Please note that you do NOT need to submit a general study abroad essay, instead please submit an essay of no more than 2 double-spaced pages which answers the following 3 questions:

1) How would your participation in the Great Cities London program enhance your academic and career goals?

2) What urban issue(s) are of particular interest to you (crime and safety, economic development, education, health and social services, housing and urban development and/or government and community participation)? Why? Is there a specific issue(s) you would like to study and research in London?

3) How would you evaluate your ability to work with a diverse group of students and successfully contribute to a team project?

- ❑ Program Deposit

Applications must be accompanied by a **non-refundable** program fee deposit of \$250, made payable to UIC Study Abroad Office. The amount of the deposit will be deducted from the cost of the program. If the program is cancelled or if the applicant is not admitted, the fee will be refunded.

Please note that the second program deposit of \$250 will be due on March 11, 2010.

If a check is returned due to insufficient funds, the applicant will be responsible for the amount of the check, plus any applicable service fees.

Please note that you will be required to submit a Medical Form signed by your physician by March 29. Please schedule your appointment in advance.

- ❑ Submit a copy of your current resume (list any extra-curricular activities, awards, honors, and/or university recognition; list recent work experience, internships or other relevant information)
- ❑ Submit a copy of your current UIC transcript with Fall 2009 grades.
