



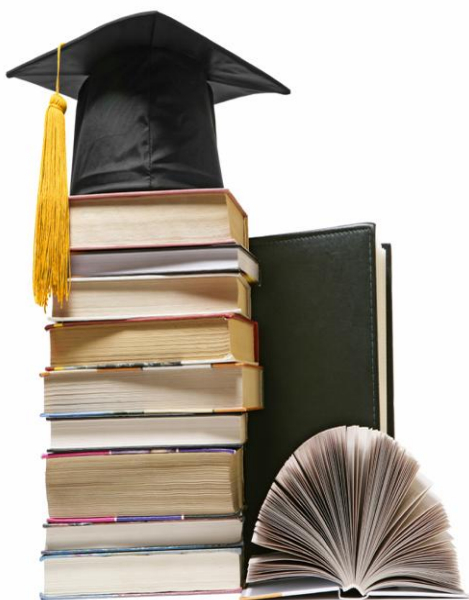

Program Information

The Summer Academic Learning Community (SALC) at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) is a collaboration between the TRIO/Academic Support Program (TRIO/ASP) and the African American Academic Network (AAAN). It is designed to help students adjust to the university community. Since 1984, the TRIO/ASP, in conjunction with AAAN and other UIC offices, has prepared more than 1,200 students for success as freshmen at UIC.

The Summer Academic Learning Community is a five week program that makes a lifetime of difference for its participants. Though it does not offer academic credit, successful students who take part in the outstanding college-level skill building workshops have the opportunity to:

- **Increase their quantitative and writing skills to feel confident about their ability to excel at the level expected of a first-year college student**
- **Retest and potentially advance to a higher-level course in mathematics and/or submit a portfolio and advance to a higher-level English course prior to the fall 2011 semester**
- **Develop the academic, leadership, critical thinking, and coping skills needed to transition from high school to college with success.**



SALC Program Format

Preparatory English & Math workshops are held from Monday through Thursday from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM on the UIC campus

Thursday's are extended as we will have either a "Lab" or "Academic Survival Workshop" and **FREE lunch!**

Exposure to collegiate materials and technology-based curriculum widely used at UIC

Students participate in **"ACADEMIC SURVIVAL WORKSHOPS"**

Workshops allow students to work closely with UIC instructors, advisors, tutors and staff who are sensitive to their needs

Benefits of the SALC Program

Workshops designed to help you perform as a 1st-year college student

Completion of financial aid award letter, housing contract, class registration, etc

An orientation to the UIC college environment, culture, policies and procedures

Develop relationships with academic advisors, tutors and other UIC students
