GREEK EASTER

To the Residents –

This is "Greek Easter Week," as announced at Dinner. The new Residents especially, will be interested to know that the Procession will occur on Friday Evening. We are told that it will leave the Holy Trinity Church, 1101 South Peoria Street, at 10:00 P.M., - coming North on Halsted street, past the House, from Roosevelt Road. Since this in perhaps the most unusual neighborhood event of the whole year, it is an occasion upon which to invite your friends to come to Hull-House.

In order that the interval between Dinner and the Procession should not be too long, Dinner will be served a little later than usual, at 7:00 P.M., in the Residents' Dining Room. There will be a special menu, appropriate to the occasion.

Once in four years, Easter on the Gregorian Calendar of the Greek Orthodox Church coincides with that on the regular Calendar. This is that year. Since 1916, the Greek Orthodox Church has adopted the regular Calendar for ordinary purposes, but continues to celebrate this one religious holiday, according to the Calendar of Constantine's time, 325 A.D.

Miss Helen Rusilla has agreed to act as a Chairman of Hull-House Candle Lighting. As everyone knows, this has always been our response to our Greek friends who go singing past our door. Miss Rusilla asks that the "Young Residents" assist her!
