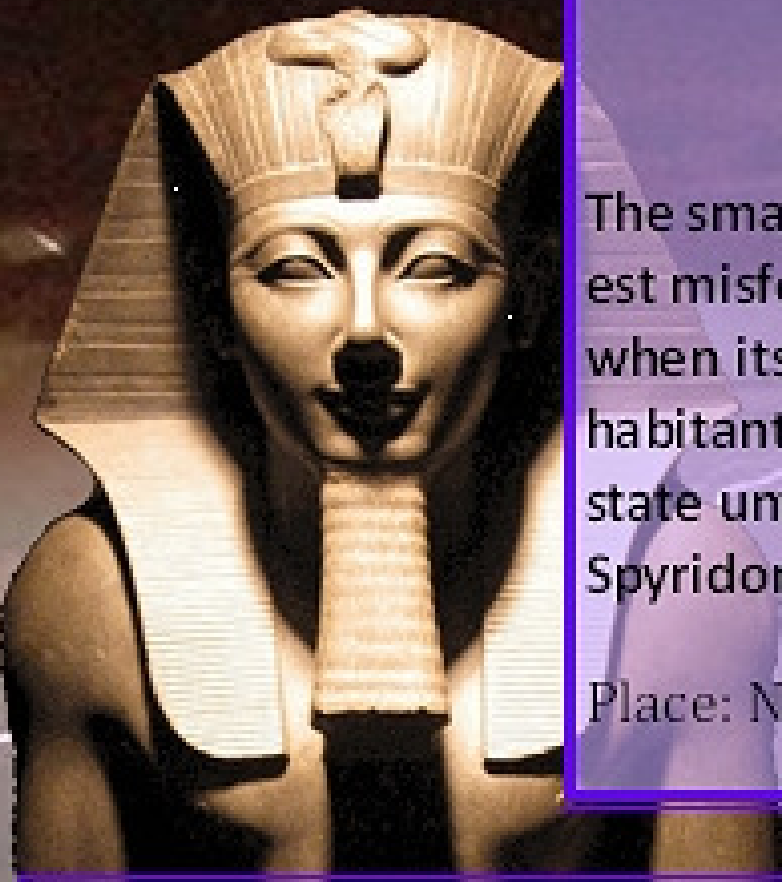

The small island of Thera (Santorini) suffered the greatest misfortune in the history of the east Mediterranean when its volcano erupted, burying thousands of its inhabitants under the ashes. The city remained in this state until the excavations of the Greek archaeologist Spyridon Marinatos in 1967.
