2 One course is required from each of the following three areas: Physical Anth, Archaeology, and Ethnography. 200-level courses may be taken in any order, fall or spring semester.

Physical anthropology-choose from 231, 235, 237, 238

Archaeology-choose from 220, 221, 222, 226, 227, 228

Ethnography-choose from 270, 271, 272, 273, 274, 275, 276, 277, 278, 279, 280, 281.

3 Four Anthropology electives are required and should be chosen in consultation with an Anth advisor. At least 2 courses must be at the 300- or 400- level. 300-level courses should be taken after 200-level courses. Anthropology 100 gives credit in the major as an elective only if it is the first course taken in Anthropology. Anthropology 100 is offered fall semester only.

4 Recommended, but not required.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at a four-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: The General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts , Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. Two additional courses will be taken from any of these categories.

\* Two of these courses may be used to satisfy two of the nine courses in the new General Education Requirement.
