1. Comm 201 satisfies the LAS Quantitative Reasoning Requirement. There is a math prerequisite.
2. Five Communication courses at the 200-, 300-, or 400-level, at least two must be at the 400-level.
3. No more than 3 hours each of Comm 474 and 498 may be applied toward the degree.

Note: Comm 100, 105, 140 and 454 do not count toward the major.

Note: To declare a major in Communication, students must complete 24 semester hours of LAS courses, earn a minimum grade of 'C' in Comm 101, and have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale).

Note: Students must earn at least 40 hours at the 200, 300, or 400-level at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts, Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. Two additional courses will be taken from any of these categories.

* Two of these courses may be used to satisfy two of the nine courses in the General Education Program.
