1. Two courses in Classics are required (exclusive of CL 100, 101, 201), chosen from the areas of Roman literature, archaeology, and history.

Note: Students who place out of one or more 100-level Latin courses may begin their six courses in GKA 299 sooner.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts, Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. Two additional courses must be taken from any of these categories.

* These courses may be used to satisfy two of the nine courses in the new General Education Requirement.
