1. CL 100 and 101 are recommended electives. They do not count toward the major.

2. Courses in Classics are required (exclusive of CL 100, 101, 201), chosen from the areas of ancient literature, archaeology, and history.

3. Of the 27 hours required in the major, at least 18 hours must be at the 200-level or above, excluding CL 201. A maximum of 9 hours may be chosen from the following related courses in other departments: ArSt 210, Hist 401, 402, 404, Phil 220, 221.

A maximum of 8 hours of the major may be chosen from approved courses in Ancient Greek or Latin.

4. Writing in the Discipline. May take Lat 299 with a WID component.

Note: The equivalent of Lat 101-104 or GkA 101-104 are required collateral courses.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts, Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society.

Two additional courses must be taken from any of these categories.

* Two of these courses may be used to satisfy two of the nine courses in the new General Education Requirement.
