**Students who must complete the basic language program (FR 101-104) before beginning the French major, will increase the amount of time required to complete the degree.

1. Fr 201 and 202 may be taken in either order.
2. Fr 301 and 302 may be taken in either order.
3. Fr 333 and 334 may be taken in either order.
4. Students are required to take two 400-level courses in French literature, culture, or grammar.

Note: Fr 333 and 301 are always only taught in the fall only and 334, 302, and 390 are always only taught in the spring only..

Note: Study abroad options are available that can significantly advance the time required to satisfy the French major/minor; this can help students who begin French in the 100-level program at UIC complete the major/minor in French in a timely manner.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at the 200, 300, or 400 level at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: The General Education Requirement for students entering before fall 2007 was 3 courses in Humanities, 3 courses in Social Sciences, 13 hours of Natural Sciences, and a Cultural Diversity course. Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural

World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts , Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. Two additional courses will be taken from any of these categories.

* Two of these courses may be used to satisfy two of the nine courses in the new General Education Requirement.
