Note: No more than 3 hours of GWS 396 maybe be applied to the major.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts , Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. Two additional courses must be taken from any of these categories.

* Two of these courses may be used to satisfy two of the nine courses in the new General Education Requirement.
