Note: Major distribution requirements may be fulfilled at any level,

- at least 6 semester hours must be taken in African, Asian, Latin American, or Middle Eastern history,
- at least 6 semester hours must be taken in ancient, medieval or modern European history,
- at least 6 semester hours must be taken in U. S. history.

Note: Students majoring in history must consult with the Director of Undergraduate Studies at least once a year.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts , Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. Two additional courses will be taken from any of these categories.
