Concentration 3: Three courses from Span 375, 376, 377, 378, 379, and one 400-level literature and culture course.

Note: Students must earn at least 40 advanced hours at a 4-year college or university. These hours may include hours in the major.

Note: Beginning fall 2007, the General Education Requirement is 9 courses, 2 laboratory courses from Analyzing the Natural World, 1 course from each of Understanding the Individual and Society, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts, Exploring World Cultures, and Understanding U.S. Society. 2 additional courses must be taken from any of these categories.
