\$999,940.00 Smoking Cessation Program. Funded by Illinois Department of Public Health, FY 2002. This was a pilot program to provide a smoking cessation program to 2,000 citizens of Illinois. The program was piloted in Northwest Illinois and included four counties. The program consisted a 4 one hour group sessions to enable smokers to stop. The program provided free
