

*Preterm* refers to an infant with gestational age of less than 37 completed weeks.

*Small for gestational age (SGA)* is a term used to describe a baby who is smaller than the usual amount for the number of weeks of pregnancy. SGA babies usually have birthweights below the 10th percentile for babies of the same gestational age, meaning that they are smaller than 90 percent of all other babies of the same gestational age.

*Infant mortality* measures the number of infants who died before their first birthday, per 1,000 live births.

*R-Gindex* (Revised Gindex) is an index for measuring the adequacy of prenatal care. This index is based on the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists' recommendations for prenatal care visits, takes into account the trimester in which care began, and includes five levels of utilization, including an "intensive utilization" category for women who have an excessively large number of prenatal care visits.
