

**Maternal and Child Health Track
PhD Requirements Effective Fall 2007**

Academic requirements for completion of the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree in the division of Community Health Sciences (CHS) are given below. Students should also review the requirements of the PhD degree described in the School of Public Health Student Handbook as well as the Graduate College Catalogue. For the PhD degree, the minimum SPH requirement is 96 semester hours, although more hours may be required by the student's advisor or by the MCH track. PhD students in Community Health Sciences with a concentration in Maternal and Child Health are required to take a constellation of 500-level MCH-related courses (specific courses taken are decided by each student and his/her advisor).

PhD students in CHS are *required* to obtain experience in classroom teaching in at least one course for at least some part of the semester. Students should refer to the teaching requirements established for PhD students in the SPH Student Handbook. Student preparation for the PhD preliminary examination should begin early (9-12 months prior to the exam is suggested) with consultation from the student's committee members.

*Up to 32 sh credit may be credited from a previous public health related master's degree. Students may also waive courses if they have taken comparable courses in their previous studies (decided upon an individual basis).
